Urine Collection

Patient Instructions for 24-Hour Urine Collection

Please read these instructions before beginning specimen collection. Collection should start after **first-morning** void and continue until the 24 hours have been completed. Include last specimen of the 24 hours for an accurate total volume.

- 1. Specimen should be refrigerated during collection and taken to the laboratory within 24 hours after completion.
- 2. Bladder should be emptied at the time that collection is scheduled to begin. This urine is to be discarded.
- 3. For the next 24 hours, all urine should be collected into a separate container at each voiding and then carefully emptied into a larger container. This 2-step procedure prevents the danger of the patient splashing himself with a preservative (such as acid) while voiding.
- 4. The large container should be kept cool during entire collection.
- 5. Collect urine voided during the night, and also collect the **first-morning** void 24 hours after test is started.

Example:

- a. Day 1 @ 7 a.m.: Patient voids and discards specimen. Patient collects all urine for the next 24 hours.
- b. Day 2 @ 7 a.m.: Patient voids and adds this urine to the previously collected urine.
- 6. Label container with patient's name (first and last), medical record number, and date and time of collection. Place container in the Laboratory Pick-Up Box.

Creatinine Clearance Instructions

- 1. Follow steps 1 through 6 above.
- 2. Serum creatinine blood must be drawn during the 24-hour period of urine collection.
- 3. No preservatives in 24-hour container.
- 4. Keep specimen refrigerated during collection, and send specimen refrigerated.

Clean-Catch, Midstream Urine Specimen

Collect a **clean-catch**, midstream urine specimen as follows:

1. Males

- a. Prepare Towelettes® by opening packages (do not remove Towelettes® until ready to use), and place them on sink. Take top off urine container, and set it on edge of sink. Set Towelettes® and container so that they can be reached while urinating.
- b. Holding back foreskin with 1 hand, if necessary, use first Towelette® to wash end of penis. Discard first Towelette® in wastebasket.
- c. Continue holding back foreskin and gently rinse end of penis using second and third Towelettes®, discarding them in wastebasket when done.
- d. Continue holding back foreskin and begin to urinate into toilet.

2. Females

- a. Prepare Towelettes® by opening packages (do not remove Towelette® until ready to use), and place them on sink. Take top off plastic urine container, and set it on edge of sink. Set Towelettes® and container so that they can be reached while urinating.
- b. Pull panties below knees so they will not interfere with urine collection. With 2 fingers of 1 hand, hold outer folds of vagina apart. With other hand, gently wash vaginal area from front to back, using first Towelette®. After this step, throw away first Towelette® in wastebasket.
- c. Still holding outer vaginal skin away from opening through which urination takes place, rinse area from front to back using Towelette® #2, discard, and repeat with Towelette® #3.
- d. Continue holding outer vaginal folds apart and begin to urinate into toilet. Lean slightly forward so urine flows directly down without running along skin.

After first few teaspoons, place tightly-sealing container under stream of urine and collect rest of urine into container. Even 1/4 cup is an adequate specimen for test.
